Good Morning Families and Students,

I am reaching out to share some very important information with you.

At yesterday's regularly scheduled Board of Trustees meeting, the Board unanimously took action to: (1) approve the recommendations of staff for in-person learning via a hybrid model; (2) approve the Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan; and (3) establish the goal that all **TK-12 students will resume in-person learning on Monday, November 16, 2020 in a hybrid model** or better. With this comes the option for families to opt in to a Distance Learning model for their child(ren).

Additionally, students with moderate to severe learning disabilities and other small groups of students who need intensive support will begin in-person learning on Monday, October 19, 2020 as per the August 25, 2020 CDPH guidelines for small learning cohorts of our students with the greatest needs.

All of this is very exciting news! I'm committed to working together with our labor partners, leaders and other stakeholders to finalize the many plans and details that are currently in progress, so we are ready to welcome our students back to our campuses in a way that is safe and healthy for students, teachers and staff.

Please watch for more information to follow very soon regarding two virtual Town Hall meetings on September 29th at 3:30 PM and October 1st At 5:00 PM when detailed information will be shared and there will be time for questions and answers.
